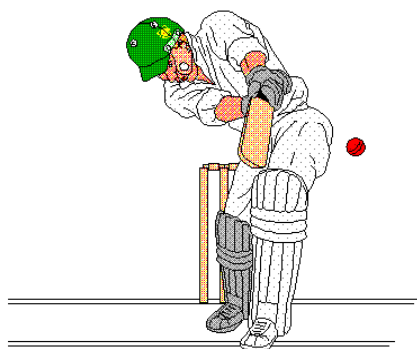

Brains came to the crease eager to score his share, but Anthony called for a single, only to run himself out from a direct throw.
