### Match Report

This match was always likely to go down to the wire even though we had convincingly beaten the Division 2 premiers in the first game of the season. Winston Hills were coming off their first win against last year's premiers the week before and had been playing some good cricket without quite getting the points.

Even the coin toss was an evenly balanced contest. Yes actually, the WHs skipper managed to land the coin on its edge! I have never seen this happen before.

Nick Chymiak our captain got the call right on the second coin toss. We were pleased to be batting first and at 1/48 (off 24 overs) were looking ok even though runs were not really flowing against the well directed bowling. At least a platform was being built... or so we thought....

Nick Paton (10) and Daniel Pesavento (29) had batted well as openers putting on 36 for the first wicket. At drinks we were 3 for 55. Someone must have spiked our drinks because not long after we were 8 for 65 and in real trouble. The bowling was not devastating but our batting and shot selection was terrible. Total collapse was 7 wickets for 17 runs.

Patrick (33 not out) and Daniel Beattie (13 not out) dug in hard at numbers 8 and 10. Their rearguard efforts steadied the ship and took us to 8 for 118 off our 55 overs. Their unbeaten partnership of 53 was invaluable.

Twenty five minutes bowling produced 3 cheap Winston Hills scalps before the end of the days play to keep the game evenly balanced. Liam and Daniel B swung the ball beautifully and were really dangerous in their opening spells. Liam knocked middle peg out of the ground with his third ball and followed up with a wicket in his next over with a great catch by Daniel P at cover point. Daniel B knocked the stumps down with a clever leg cutter.

The second week wickets were hard to come by in the wet conditions as WHs batted patiently and defended their wickets very well. At 5 for 105 and within 16 runs of victory things were not looking so good. However, the KL boys lifted in the field. Daniel Beattie's return to the bowling crease produced two wickets including their top scorer (bowled) and their second top scorer (caught by Nick P). A run out by Joshua gave us a glimmer of hope. Captain Cool Nick C joined Liam bowling at "the death" to produce the match winning deliveries by clean bowling the last two batsmen for a win by 3 runs.

Make no mistake – this was a game we didn't deserve to win. Winston Hills were the better side. Our batting was disappointing the first week with soft dismissals and poor shot selection. We were sloppy in the field and gave away around 25 runs. We missed a number of run out chances and played tunnel ball on too many occasions. Basically we got out of jail twice in this match.

I was pleased however in the manner in which the side fought back both weeks. An unbeaten 9th wicket partnership of 53 gave us something to defend. To take 5 wickets for 11 to win by 3 runs showed the fighting spirit of this team and how to kill a coach.

Bowling figures were Daniel B 3 for 15 off 8 overs, Liam 2 for 6 off 6 overs and Nick Chymiak 2 for 9 off 7 overs. Varun and Patrick were the other wicket takers.

Final score KL 8 for 118 beat Winston Hills 115 on first innings by 3 runs.
