Match Report

Daniel Beattie again led our bowling attack with 3 for 11. He was backed up by Blake Belcastro 2 for 5, Nick Chymiak 2 for 10 and Patrick O'Reilly 2 for 23 and Nicholas Paton 1 for 8. Patrick took a stunning running catch at fine leg and then followed up diving forward for another behind square. Good catches were also taken by Blake, Joshua, Nick C and Varun. Daniel B made a great stumping after Patrick enticer drew the batsman down the wicket.

Patrick played a dogged hand for 17 runs but it was the batting of Daniel B and Joshua Bain that gave us a glimmer of hope and raised the blood pressure of the Baulkham Hill's coach. Their partnership of 21 runs were earned the hard way under "attrition warfare" conditions and got us back into the match. This was Joshua's first innings after re-joining the side and it was full of character and determination.

In a low scoring match Daniel Beattie's 22 runs was the top score and would have been worth many more on another day. Combined with his bowling efforts of 3/11 and a neat stumping earned him the Man of the Match points.

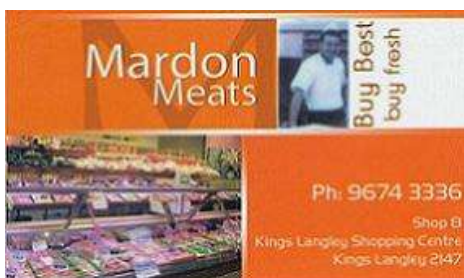
