Match Report

Seven catches including three fantastic catches by Liam at behind square and others by Daniel Beattie, Joshua, Nathan and Nick Chymiak plus a stumping (by Daniel B) and a run out (by Nicholas Paton) add up to our best fielding effort so far this season.

As we kept the pressure on the Wenty batsman Patrick was able to weave a magic spell of leg spin bowling to capture 5 for 13 off his 8 overs. Patrick's spin and bounce even had one of the Wenty players duck underneath a good length ball for a high take by our keeper Daniel B. The other wicket takers Liam Gillies 1for 9, Daniel P 1 for 11 and Nicholas P 1 for 7 also bowled well. Nicholas P's wicket was a big one with a left arm in swinging "hawk eye" special.

All bowlers worked to the team plan to keep the pressure on and give nothing away and this was helped by L. Grass (our extra fielder.)

In these conditions 97 was worth a few more than it looked so we knew we were going to be a tough battle the next week against the Wenty attack.

With playing conditions and player comfort levels the same as the previous week a great start by Daniel Pesavanto and Liam got us to 36 before Daniel lost concentration just before drinks and fell to a tired shot for 16 (2 fours). We were helped by Wenty's wayward bowling with 17 wides in the first 25 overs. A mini collapse after drinks took us to 4 for 39 before Will Reardon and Blake Belcastro put on a determined partnership of 51 and a first innings victory by 5 wickets.

Reardo did what Ponting had been saying and took on the responsibility as captain to score the runs in partnership with Blake to win this game. Both batted with determination and intelligence.

Final score – Kings Langley 5 for 101 defeated Wenty Leagues 97 on first innings by 5 wickets.
