Match Report

We had a mathematical chance of making the finals, and the boys knew if they brought their "A" game we'd have done our part and the rest would be in the hands of the other sides.

It started very well for us with some extremely tight bowling and consistent wicket taking that restricted our visitors to 87 from 55 overs. Liam backed up his effort from last round and took 2/7 with Jarryd, economical as always, taking 2/11. Michael, Haydon, a miserly Cameron, and a vastly improved Shubham, chipped in with a wicket each. The catching was excellent - 5 catches taken in all, but despite 2 well-executed run outs, our fielding let us down a little towards the end of the innings. We had allowed Baulkham Hills to post a total, of sorts.

Nevertheless, 88 was achievable for us, but not for the first time this season we capitulated with the bat and showed our real weakness to good line and length bowling. It was somewhat disappointing to be dismissed for a sombre 34 with very few highlights apart from a useful 7 from Michael and a boundary from Jarryd.

Even more disappointing for us was that Baulkham Hills decided to go after the outright. They asked us to bowl again, but to the credit of KL were unable to get away, so declared at 3/24 after 9 overs. Haydon took 1/11 and Michael completed two excellent run outs. We had 1 hour left to bat with some trepidation, but for a reason that will remain a mystery to us, a different side went out to defend our honour and saw the game off at 2/30 after 11 overs. Baulkham Hills could find no way through and were happy to take the first innings victory. Liam returned his high of 9*, his FIFTH not out of the season and Haydon was at the other end on 6*. The batting and running between wickets in the 2nd innings was quite superb and we are left bemused and wondering where that has been throughout the season when it was needed most.

As it stands we won't be in the finals this year, but we gave it a good go. The boys gave 100% and have improved tremendously under Coach Jason. They should be proud of their efforts because we certainly are.

Thanks to all the parents for showing their support and helping out when needed. It has been a long season with many ups and perhaps many more downs, but heads remain high and we look forward to doing it all again next year.

Match Report

Our coin toss record for the season stands at 2 from 12 as we were sent into bat in wet and lush conditions. Well struck shots along the ground went nowhere as we lost 3 early wickets. Robert (19) and Patrick (12) were re-establishing our innings at 3 for 58 when we lost both of them holing out easy catches straight to fieldsmen. Robert's 3 well struck hook shots for boundaries were a highlight of the pre drinks session as runs were very hard to come by.

Another 4 wickets lost meant we were 9 for 86 when Reardo joined Varun. These two sensibly batted out the overs to put on 35 valuable runs for the last wicket when Varun was run out in over number 59 for a well compiled 12. Will remained undefeated on 23 with 3 fours and 1 six in a determined and intelligent innings. Our score of 121 was worth more given the slow ground but we knew we would have to bowl and field well to come out on top.

The grass and boundaries had shrunk in the wash the second week but the boys were determined to make it an arm wrestle. Robert (2 for 9) had got us back into the match with his 2 clean bowled wickets before drinks but at 6 for 84 a renewed effort was called for. We were picking up a wicket every 10 runs or so and at 7 for 101 Wenty were on track to overtake our total. A decisive spell by Daniel D with 3 for 5 off 4 overs made the difference as did some excellent catches. Daniel D removed the Wenty top scorer when Blake took a good catch at backward gully. Ethan came forward to just pick up another great catch at point and Varun caught the snick to win the game in taking his second catch behind the stumps. Daniel had earlier also taken one of the best catches of the season diving forward at backward square. Will and Liam also made their catches look easy.

Other successful bowlers were: Liam 1-11, Will 1-9, Nick P 1-11, Patrick 1-15, Daniel P 1-13.

Fielding points went to Varun (3) – no byes, two good catches behind the stumps, Daniel D (2) – catch of the season and good energy and enthusiasm, Patrick (1) – good saves on the boundary and throws from the deep.

Final score: Kings Langley 121 beat Wenty Leagues 102 on first innings by 19 runs.
