Match Report

Finchie was introduced to the attack and was successful in his second over to pick up the other opening batsman thanks to a good catch by Matt at keeper. Gareth and Owen were next into the attack, both with immediate impact picking up a wicket each in their first 2 overs. Both players picked up regular wickets to see Guildford all out for 137 in 43 overs. Gareth the pick of the bowlers finishing with a very economical 3/18 from 8 overs, well bowled! Owen next best with 3-29, Tets 2-31, and Rocket chimed in at the end to pick up a wicket, finishing with 1-29. Rocket also doing the job in the field finishing with 3 catches.

So with Freney away on day 1, we sent Finchie in with Terence to have a swing, and that he did! Finchie hit 3 boundaries in his innings of 14 before him timing one a little too well and was caught at cover. Paul mistimed a pool shot and copped one on the hand to be caught off the glove at square leg to have us 2/20. Dowie joined Terence and the pair looked very comfortable putting on 45 for the 3rd wicket before Tezza was out for 26 trying to flick one fine of the pads. Well batted. KL 3/65 at end of the days play, Dowie not out on 19.

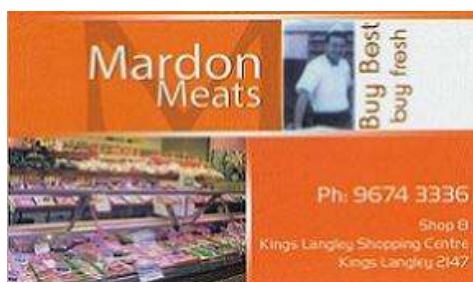
Match Report
