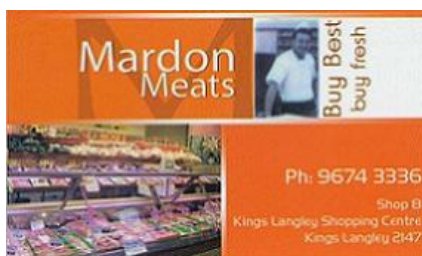
### Match Report
