After this onslaught our bowling tightened things up and while the fielding was enthusiastic we still managed to drop at least 7 chances most of which were not too difficult. A few run outs were missed also. Thus, while it was a reasonable fight back by the Kings Langley boys and everyone stuck to their task the Rouse Hill score of 204 was probably 50 or 60 more than it should have been had we taken our chances.

Our best bowlers were Nick Chymiak 2/10, Daniel Pesavento 2/12 and Liam Gillies 2/19. Other wicket takers were Will, Reardon, Daniel Dumbrell, Ethan Austin and Nicholas Paton.

Fielding points went to Blake (3) – many good stops and throws, Varun (2) – tidy wicket keeping and intensity in the field when spelled and Daniel D(1)- 2 catches.

Our batting effort the second week was pretty good with all the boys showing a determined approach to chasing the 204. We should gain lots of confidence from our batting effort against one of the competition front runners even though we fell short of the target by 9 runs. Liam was very solid at the top of the order against some very lethal bowling from the Rams rep. Will's 53 was a very well compiled innings mixing defence and attack to score 7 boundaries.

Congratulations Will on your first 50 and you're first Honour Roll Performance. Plenty more to come (including some with 3 figures beside your name!)

Blake's 25 (4 fours) in a partnership of 68 with Will gave us a chance and had the Rams on the run until the rep returned for his second spell to dismiss both Blake and Will.

Unfortunately we were unable to get over the line as the Rams held their catches to take the last 4 wickets for 19 runs and the 6 competition points.

Lessons to be learnt:

This is the second game in a row we have played well for half the game only. We must play well both batting and bowling/fielding departments.

Dropped catches and short length bowling is NOT the formula for success.

Numbers 1 to 5 in the batting order all got decent starts scoring 11, 10, 10, 16, and 11. All looked solid at the start of their innings but didn't go on for a big score when there was one or two to be made if we are determined and disciplined and avoid the get out shots.

Final score Rouse Hill 204 beat Kings Langley 195 on first innings.
