The weather forecasters had predicted a 40 degree plus day so good use of the early cool conditions and cross breeze saw us bowled out for 54 by the 24th over. A disappointing batting display with no one getting set and taking control. As usual Baulko took all their catches and stopped many runs with their ground fielding. Add to this a direct hit run out and being one player short this was not the start to the New Year we had planned on.

The boys stuck to the fielding task well but an early dropped catch and some short and wide bowling kept the momentum in their favour until they were within sight of victory at 2-46. A run out by Daniel Dumbrell from a great diving stop and throw to Nathan prized open their batting to trigger a collapse of 5 wickets for 3 runs and give us a sniff. Varun played a key part by taking 3 excellent catches in the gully as our bowlers finally found the right line and length. Ethan's 2 wickets in his first over and Liam's wicket on the first ball next over gave us a team hatrick. In the end we were 20 runs short as the Baulko No 7 and No 9 saw them home.

Ethan took the honours with bowling figures of 3-1 in a dynamic performance. Liam finished with 2 for 19 but was extremely unlucky not to have claimed another couple of wickets as a number of his deliveries had the batsmen completely beaten but somehow managing to miss the stumps. Another coat of varnish would have made a big difference.

Fielding points were awarded to Varun 3 (three great catches in the gully), Daniel D 2 (threw himself around and ran out one of the openers), Blake 1 (good ground fielding and throws from the deep).

Final score: Baulkham Hills 7-58 beat KL 54 on first innings.
