Our openers Daniel P and Will got us away to a great start quickly overcoming some initial nerves to take on the Babas bowling attack. Both worked well together in their partnership of 41 runs in 8 overs and this set the tone for the rest of the innings as it was controlled positive batting by both Daniel and Will in defending the good balls and putting the loose ones away.

The momentum was steadily building as Daniel D and Blake got them settled in. Soon the runs were flowing with shots all around the ground with some fine attacking shots when the opportunity presented. Ethan and Patrick pushed the score along in the last 5 overs to put on 43 very valuable runs.

Batting scorecard highlights were as follows:

Daniel D 52 (7 fours, 2 sixes), Will 38 (5 fours), Blake 27 (2 fours, 1 six), Patrick 25 not out (4 fours) and Ethan 10 not out (2 fours). This was our best batting effort all season because it was disciplined and controlled batting in compiling 5 for 186 off 31 overs.

The Baba's run chase at 6 per over was always going to be tough but our opening bowling attack of our 2 left armers, Liam and Nicholas P made it even more difficult with their accuracy and challenging deliveries to have our opposition 0-12 after 8 overs. Robbie cashed in from these efforts as the pressure became intense for the BaBas with a good outswinger and a neat catch by Liam at first slip. Daniel P bowled an excellent spell swinging the ball well to claim 1-12 off 4 overs and Patrick and Ethan chimed in with a wicket each. As the BaBas payed more aggressively things got a little untidy until Will (3-13) came on to clean up the middle order and then Liam (2-21) got through the tail. A run out by Ethan in combination with Nathan was icing on the cake as we bowled out Hills Babas for 123.

Overall our fielding efforts were good with 8 catches and a run out although we got a little untidy in the middle section with a few chances going down and bonus runs given away through some tunnel ball and overthrows.

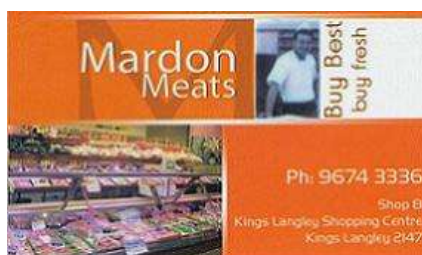
Final score: KL 5-186 beat Hills Barbarians 123 on first innings.
